The Development Officer will provide leadership for private fund raising efforts that support early childhood education, school readiness, family literacy, behavioral health, child welfare, youth and after school, and other family support programs. On an annual basis, the Hope Street Margolis Family Center serves over 2,000 low-income children and families.
