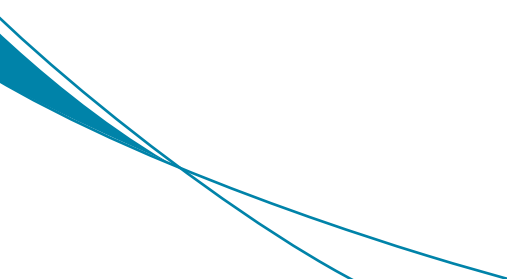

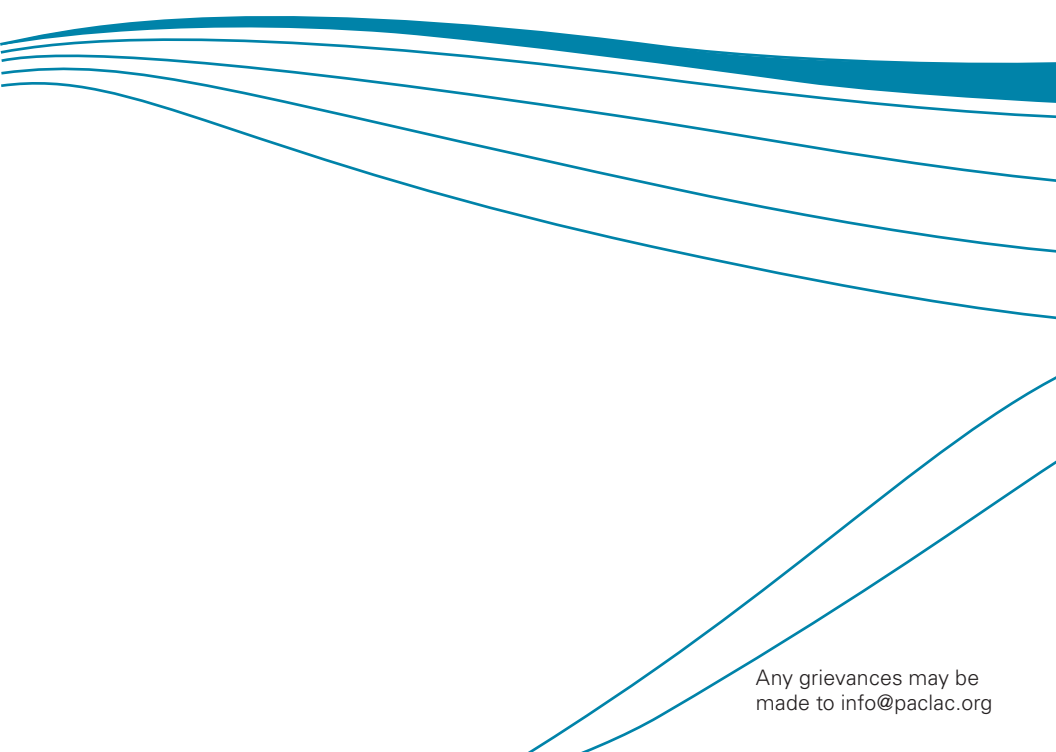
**Certificate Policy:**

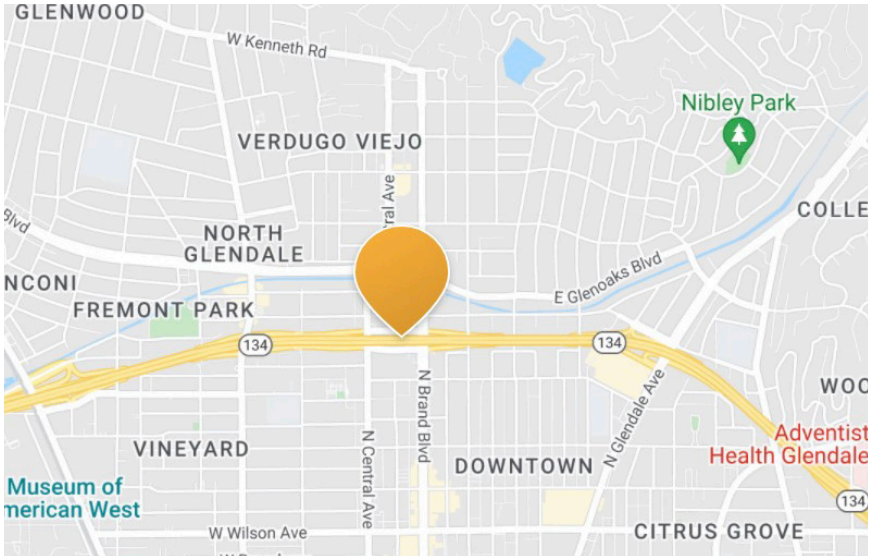
